BACKGROUND

The purpose of this report is to present the Board of Health with the 2019 operating results for Public Health Programs. Ottawa Public Health (OPH) management actively monitors spending and revenue results for any underlying issues needing to be highlighted or addressed.

The 2019 operating budget year-end results present actual year-end revenues and expenditures against the amounts previously budgeted for the year.

DISCUSSION

As indicated in the <u>2019 Operating Budget Q2 Status Report</u>, OPH was projecting a balanced financial position for the 2019 fiscal year. OPH ended the year on budget while addressing emerging community health pressures such as cannabis implementation, the 2019 flood response, the supervised consumption services transition plan, infection prevention and control lapses (IPAC) as well as other events and adjusting for a zero percent cost of living increase from the Ontario Ministry of Health. Savings from operational program reviews, including procurement, strategic staffing and additional one-time revenues, enabled OPH to offset unexpected costs.

Supporting Document 1 provides operating budget details on year-end results for the various Ontario Public Health Standards. Financial information is presented by programs, which includes cost shared (75% provincial and 25% municipal), City funded (100% municipal) and provincially funded (100% provincial). Below, Table 1 provides a summary of the 2019 year-end results.

Supporting Document 2 provides a summary of the budget adjustments and transfers made in the third and fourth quarters of 2019, through the delegated authority given to the Medical Officer of Health (MOH). The Board of Health's Delegation of Authority Bylaw requires the reporting of these transactions for information purposes.
