BACKGROUND

The Shenkman Arts Centre (SAC) will enter its eighth year of operation in 2017. A sustainable funding model to support the capital needs of the Theatres is necessary to ensure they remain professionally equipped and provide a quality experience for patrons.

In March 2005, Council approved the creation of a Capital Renewal Fund (CRF) to fund future capital program requirements at Centrepointe Theatre through the collection of a

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ticket surcharge of \$1.25. Over the years, this fund has allowed Centrepointe Theatres to replace the seating and draperies, the audio system, and dimmers, to complete upgrades the lift for persons with disabilities and to electrical systems, and to acquire a new monitor console and speakers ensuring the performance spaces remain state-of-the-art.

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DISCUSSION

The Shenkman Arts Centre, moving into its eighth year of operation, hosts over 400 events in its theatres annually. Equipment is aging and new technologies are emerging making current systems obsolete, and general wear and tear of the performance spaces requires ongoing maintenance.

The Shenkman Arts Centre Strategic Plan states that one of its priority objectives is to generate new funds for facility improvements. In response to this objective and the impending life-cycle needs of the Theatres, the Community Consultative Group of the Shenkman Arts Centre has been consulted and have endorsed the creation of a ticketing surcharge starting January 1, 2017 to support capital improvements of the Centre's theatres.

A recent survey conducted by staff in March 2015 identified that Ottawa facilities similar to the Shenkman Arts Centre (Centrepointe Theatres, Great Canadian Theatre Company and the National Arts Centre) and other similar Ontario facilities (Sony Centre (Toronto), Centre in the Square (Kitchener), Massey Hall (Toronto), Oakville Arts Centre, St. Catharines Arts Centre) have established capital renewal funds, with surcharges applied on their tickets ranging from \$0.75 to \$3.00.

Ticket surcharges of \$1.25 per ticket purchased for a show in Harold Shenkman Hall (HSH) and \$0.75 for tickets purchased for a show in Richcraft Theatre (RT) will be applied, or a flat fee of \$100 in HSH or \$50 in RT will be applied to rental clients with non-ticketed events or who opt to not use the City's box office provider. Aligned with Centrepointe Theatres' established approach, the surcharge will not be applied to tickets for performances for school audiences, young audience programming (under the age of 12 years old), and high school graduations.

The Shenkman Art Centreg Reserve Fund shall be operated, managed and maintained by the City Treasurer from:

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- a. the ticket surcharge collected on each ticket sold for events at Shenkman Theatres;
- b. the earnings derived from the investment of moneys held in the Shenkman Theatres Reserve Fund; and
- c. any allocation from such other sources or revenue as may be determined by the Council for the City of Ottawa.

It is estimated that the new fund will generate approximately \$40,000 annually for theatre equipment replacement, upgrades to front of house and backstage areas, and theatre system upgrades. Annually, staff in consultation with SAC's Building and Asset Development Committee will establish priorities and recommendations regarding the Capital Renewal Fund spending plan.

RURAL IMPLICATIONS

There are no specific rural implications.

CONSULTATION

Staff have consulted with the Shenkman Arts Centre Community Consultative Group of the Centre's Strategic Plan, comprising of resident arts partners, rental clients, neighbouring businesses, and other stakeholders, who have endorsed a ticketing surcharge being introduced for funding capital program requirements related to the operation of the theatres at the Shenkman Arts Centre.

LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

There are no legal impediments to the implementation of the report recommendation.

RISK MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

There are no risk implications.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

There are no financial implications. Staff will submit the necessary By-Law to Council to enact the Reserve Fund.

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ACCESSIBILITY IMPACTS

The Capital Renewal Fund will help replace equipment that will maintain current accessibility standards and improve access to live performances over time.

Examples include:

Assisted Listening Devices – Will need to be replaced to provide better speech-to-noise ratios for patrons who are hard of hearing.

Audience Seating – As audience seating is replaced in both theatres, there are opportunities to improve accessible seating.

Video Infrastructure – New video equipment may open opportunities to distribute live performances to patrons unable to attend a performance in person.

Lobby Furniture – As lobby furniture is replaced, there are opportunities to improve accessible seating.

TERM OF COUNCIL PRIORITIES

Healthy and Caring Communities: HC4 – Support Arts, Heritage and Culture.

DISPOSITION

The Parks, Recreation and Cultural Services Department will implement the ticket surcharge by January 1, 2017 as outlined within this report.
