I thought poor treatment might deter her from reporting in the future and I suggested she seek advice elsewhere. She did not know where else to go so we ended up going to Elgin. We dealt with Officer Craig Barlow and he was fantastic. When my friend expressed that she was afraid of retaliation from her former partner if she reported, Officer Barlow offered to have one of the partner assault detectives speak to her. When one wasn't available, he put her in touch with a victim's unit via telephone. He demonstrated compassion, patience, and professionalism throughout this interaction. I felt like he went above and beyond to help my friend feel comfortable. He never pushed her into a particular course of action. Officer Barlow's professionalism and courteous attitude ought to be recognized and celebrated in this police force. their presence. In particular, Constable Jeff Simpson managed to establish a sense of calm and focus that enabled my sister to comprehend what was happening and what her options were. I was stunned when she agreed to get help, something I was sure she would reject. She has also thanked me for the intervention, which I know is certainly in large part due to the approach that Cst. Simpson took with her. He was humane, respectful and empathetic of her circumstances. At no time did she feel judged, because of her condition, she just felt that everyone there was there because they wanted to help. I realize the toll that extending yourself and caring for others can have on first responders. It is apparent that it takes very special people to engage with people who often do not appreciate the help. I did not want to let it go without acknowledging this and expressing my sincere gratitude to Cst. Simpson and all of the amazing police and paramedics for helping my family at its worst.
