#### RECOMMANDATIONS DU RAPPORT

#### **BACKGROUND**

On August 27, 2014, Ottawa City Council approved the acquisition of land located at 4235 McKenna Casey Drive for the construction of a new Stormwater Management Facility to serve the South Nepean Urban Area, replacing the existing Foster Stormwater Management Facility. Construction of this new Stormwater Management Facility began in July 2015 and is scheduled to be completed by late summer 2016.

The land in question was purchased from Mr. and Mrs. Gerald and Terry Casey, who have asked that the new facility be named for their son, Gregory, who passed away in April 2008 at the age of 29. The name Gregory Casey has been vetted through Emergency Services and does not pose any concerns with name duplication.

As this naming proposal does not fit within the guidelines of the Commemorative Naming Policy, which specifically prohibits memorials but allows Council to assign a commemorative name by resolution notwithstanding the provisions of this policy, it is requested that Planning Committee recommend Council approve that the new Stormwater Management Facility, being constructed at 4235 McKenna Casey Drive, be named the "Gregory Casey Stormwater Management Facility.

#### DISCUSSION

The Planning and Growth Management Department and the Infrastructure Services Department support the recommendations outlined in this report.

#### **RURAL IMPLICATIONS**

There are no rural implications associated with this report.

### **CONSULTATION**

This report was posted to the City's website on 15 September 2015 as part of the Planning Committee Agenda for the 22 September 2015 meeting. This meeting was advertised in Le Droit and City-wide EMC community newspapers.

The proposed name was approved by Mr. and Mrs. Gerald and Terry Casey, and was vetted through Emergency Services, who had no concerns.

# COMMENTS BY THE WARD COUNCILLOR(S)

Councillor Harder provided the following comment in support of the naming proposal:

"The Casey property recently purchased by the City for purposes of building a new Stormwater management pond. The Casey family would like to honour their son who grew up here. This application has the support of their Barrhaven neighbours and I trust all of you will as well."

### **LEGAL IMPLICATIONS**

There are no legal impediments to the implementation of the recommendations in this report.

The Commemorative Naming Policy, approved by City Council on July 24, 2002, outlines the criteria and process for commemoratively naming municipal streets, parks and facilities (or parts thereof). On February 13, 2013, during consideration of the Mid-Term Governance Review Report, Council approved an amendment to the Commemorative Naming Policy such that "in memoriam" naming proposals be referred to the City programs designed for that purpose. These programs include the Memorial Tree Program, the Memorial Park Bench Program, the Roadside Memorials Program and the Adopt-a-Park/Adopt-a-Roadway Program.

However, the *Commemorative Naming Policy* does provide the following exception:

"In keeping with its powers set out in the *Municipal Act*, 2001, Council may assign a commemorative name by resolution, notwithstanding the provisions included in the Commemorative Naming Policy."
