SUBJECT: APPOINTMENT OF SPECIAL CONSTABLES: CARLETON UNIVERSITY

## **RECOMMENDATION**

That the Ottawa Police Services Board approve the appointments of Nicholas Lebrun-Ellerton, Ross Seager and Daryl Slater as Special Constables pursuant to Section 53 of the *Police Services Act*, in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in the attached Approval of Appointment form.

## BACKGROUND

In May 1996, the Ottawa Police Service Executive and Carleton University administration approved the program for the Carleton University Special Constable Services. This appointment would enable the Carleton University Special Constables to supplement the law enforcement provided by the Ottawa Police Service (OPS) in respect to Campus Safety. Their appointments would continue for a period of five years.

The initiative was based on the desire to continually improve the delivery of policing services to the residents of the City of Ottawa by capitalizing on the existing co-operation between the OPS and Carleton University. The opportunity existed to build on the interoperability of the two organizations and the goodwill gained.

To ensure that these employees can carry out their assigned duties, applications are made to the Ministry of Community Safety and Correctional Services to have them appointed as Special Constables pursuant to Section 53 of the *Police Services Act*. The Board appoints the employees as Special Constables upon approval by the Ministry. The appointments are valid for five years.

### **DISCUSSION**

Approval has been obtained from the Ministry of Community Safety and Correctional Services for the appointment of these employees as Special Constables. Pursuant to Section 53 of the

*Police Services Act*, upon receipt of the Board appointment of their status, the member will be required to undertake the Oath of Office by the Chief of Police.
