#### **BACKGROUND**

Board policy B.23 relates to Board participation in library-related conferences, meetings, and events. It states in part: "The experience of participating in conferences, seminars or workshops is a valuable opportunity for Library Board Trustees, and one that benefits the trustee and the Library." Library Board members are encouraged to attend relevant library conferences as a means to promote Board development and excellence. The policy also states that at least one trustee be selected to attend the Canadian Library Association Conference. This report highlights both the upcoming Canadian Library Association Conference and the American Library Association Conference.

## **DISCUSSION**

# 2014 Canadian Library Association Conference

The Canadian Library Association Conference held once a year is a national professional and trustee development event offering more than 10 in-depth preconference sessions, three organized tours, and over 100 sessions on a wide variety of issues. CLA will provide opportunities to learn new ideas, share success stories, hear best practices, and meet colleagues from across the country. This year, the event is being held from May 28 to May 31, 2014 at the Victoria Conference Centre, with the theme: *Building Bridges to the Future – Colleagues, collaboration and consultation will get us there.* Detailed information on the upcoming conference, including access to the conference program in electronic form is available on the CLA website at <a href="http://cla.pwwebhost.com/conference/2014/">http://cla.pwwebhost.com/conference/2014/</a>. 2014 keynote speakers include:

 Richard Wagamese: One of Canada's foremost Native authors and storytellers, Richard has been working as a professional writer since 1979. He's been a newspaper columnist and reporter, radio and television broadcaster and producer, documentary producer, and the author of twelve titles from major Canadian publishers.

• Elizabeth Renzetti: A national columnist with the Globe and Mail, Elizabeth has been the newspaper's Arts and Books editor, and for almost a dozen years was a correspondent in the London and Los Angeles bureaus. She appears frequently on radio and television to discuss current events. A journalist for almost 25 years, she is currently the Rogers Distinguished Visiting Professor at Ryerson University in Toronto. Her work has appeared in many publications, including "Maclean's", "Report on Business Magazine", "Chatelaine" and "Elle Canada".

Monique Brûlé, Manager, Collection Development will be presenting at this year's conference, with her session entitled "Crowdsourcing Your Way to Strategic Planning: the Imagine Campaign at OPL". This session will outline the theoretical basis for the use of crowdsourcing as well as the steps used in preparing and executing the Imagine campaign.

OPL Librarian Céline St-Martin, will be part of a panel discussion and Q&A period, intended to provide participants with an increased understanding of the challenges faced by newcomers to Canada as well as a keen awareness of the vital role that public libraries play in assisting newcomers in overcoming these challenges.

Chair Harder has also been confirmed as a speaker as part of a session called "Public Library Success Stories from the Trustee Network: A Roundtable for Public Libraries, their Boards and Friends." This roundtable session, sponsored by the Trustee Network, a unit of CLA, will give participants the chance to hear several people describe how their libraries have successfully managed such current challenges as obtaining funding, building new facilities, coping with new technology, and making their library a central part of community life.

# **2014 American Library Association Conference**

American Library Association (ALA) Annual Conference programs, updates, conversations, and other events cover key issues such as digital content and e-books, technology in libraries, innovation, books and hundreds of authors, leadership, library advocacy, community engagement, and library marketing. The conference plays host to a wide range of networking opportunities, with the 2014 theme: *Transforming Our Libraries, Ourselves*. Participants will hear a master of the modern memoir talk about this personal reflection on women's choices, her unforgettable portrait of a woman, a family, and a troubled homeland.
- Stan Lee: Known to millions as the man whose Super Heroes propelled Marvel to its preeminent position in the comic book industry and whose co-creations include Spider-Man<sup>™</sup>, The Avengers <sup>™</sup>, X-Men<sup>™</sup>, Iron Man<sup>™</sup>, The Incredible

Hulk<sup>™</sup>, The Fantastic Four<sup>™</sup>, and hundreds of others. Lee will talk among other things about his forthcoming action-packed illustrated novel *Zodiac*, based on the Chinese Zodiac.

- Alexander McCall Smith: Alexander McCall Smith is the author of the internationally acclaimed No. 1 Ladies' Detective Agency series. He has more than 100 books he has written or contributed to. Books in the No. 1 Ladies' Detective Agency series have been translated into 45 languages and sold more than 20 million copies worldwide, and the Isabel Dalhousie series that followed immediately leapt onto bestseller lists.
- Ilyasah Shabazz: Community organizer, activist, motivational speaker, and author of the critically acclaimed *Growing Up X*, Ilyasah Shabazz will move participants as she talks about what inspires and motivates her.
