#### REPORT RECOMMENDATION

That the Ottawa Public Library Board approve The United Muslim Organizations of Ottawa-Gatineau (UMOOG) for the Order of Friendship, in recognition of their impact in the community via their partnership with the Ottawa Public Library to deliver Summer Reading Club Make-It-Kits to vulnerable children aged 6 to 12.

#### **BACKGROUND**

As per Board Policy 019 OPLB – Order of Friendship, the Ottawa Public Library (OPL) Board recognizes exceptional volunteer contributions made to the OPL by individuals, groups, and / or institutions. Eligible contributions are those that help to improve the OPL's ability to deliver services to the community, furthering the OPL's mission.

The OPL Board Order of Friendship is awarded in the second and fourth years of the term, upon nomination by Trustees. The purpose of this report is to put forth a nomination for consideration.

#### DISCUSSION

The United Muslim Organizations of Ottawa-Gatineau (UMOOG), led by Jalil Marnhouj, is a group of ten mosques and community centres in the national capital region.

UMOOG and Ms. Marnhouj are nominated for the OPL Board Order of Friendship for their contributions to the community through:

- a) Their role in supporting Ottawa residents during the COVID-19 pandemic, engaging 250+ volunteers for a variety of projects; and,
- b) Their role in supporting the OPL's pandemic response, by helping deliver Summer Reading Club Make-It-Kits to vulnerable children aged 6 to 12.

The United Muslim Organizations of Ottawa-Gatineau have supported many residents at risk of social isolation during the pandemic. UMOOG volunteers have delivered groceries, medicine, and supplies for elderly, at-risk, and / or immunocompromised residents, as well as single-parent families with children. UMOOG has also provided financial support, such as assistance with purchasing food kits, medicine, and supplies, to those who have lost their primary source of income. They have also provided 1,000 families with 80,000 meals.

During the summer, UMOOG partnered with OPL to deliver Make-It Kits to families. Make-It Kits were created by OPL to bring Summer Reading Club activities to vulnerable Ottawa families: the kits include supplies and instructions for ten Summer Reading Club-themed activities (also available on OPL's YouTube channel). UMOOC helped connect Library staff with families who might benefit from a kit, Library staff assembled and delivered the kits to UMOOG volunteers, and these volunteers delivered 200 Make-It-Kits to families. UMOOG has been a key part of connecting OPL to the

community, ensuring many more children were able to participate in Summer Reading Club activities this year.

#### **CONSULTATION**

An Ad hoc Committee was established in September 2020 composed of Trustees Meehan and Slack to review nominations and provide recommendations to the Board.

Trustees were asked to provide nominations by September 2020. Three nominations were received. The Order of Friendship Ad hoc Committee of the Board discussed the nominations and supports the recommendation outlined in this report.
