The officer was finishing a call in our neighbourhood and he noticed me struggling with my stepson. To the average person it would have looked like I was trying to be overly controlling, when in reality I was trying to keep him from running. When the officer asked if everything was OK and I

explained the situation, he automatically offered to show my stepson the lights and sirens on his police vehicle and let him check out the backseat to help change his thoughts. It was wonderful to see how the officer stayed calm and just let my stepson hang out while he did his report, like it was no big deal. The officer was so kind and calm which is so important when an autistic child is having a tantrum or meltdown for both child and parent. He seemed to just know how to handle the situation perfectly which we truly appreciate. We have tried hard to teach our stepson that police officers are safe people that he can always go to if he is lost or needs help and today this officer helped to reinforce that for us.
