Document 3 - Comparator Review

Every municipality has specific regulations regarding the place of signs. For example, signs cannot create a safety hazard, and municipalities each have specific restrictions for the permitted proximity to roads, boulevards, sidewalks, intersections, etc. Some other notable restrictions are highlighted in the table below, which includes by-law regulations in a number of municipalities of Ontario as of June 2021.
