REPORT RECOMMENDATIONS

That City Council receive and table the Crime Prevention Ottawa Draft 2022 Operating Budget at its meeting of November 3, 2021 for subsequent consideration by Council in Committee of the Whole to be held December 8, 2021.

RECOMMANDATIONS DU RAPPORT

Que le Conseil municipal reçoive et dépose le budget de fonctionnement préliminaire 2021 de Prévention du crime Ottawa à sa réunion du 3 novembre 2021, en vue de son étude en comité plénier par le Conseil le 8 décembre 2021.

BACKGROUND

On July 21, 2021 Council approved the 2022 budget directions, timeline and consultation process. The report recommended that the municipal tax increase be set at 3 percent overall.

DISCUSSION

Council's approved budget strategy required that, as part of the annual budget process, the budget allocation for all local Boards and Commissions be based on their individual pro-rated share of the tax target and any assessment growth. As the tax bill is made up of several different levies that in order to achieve a 3 percent increase, the city-wide levy, which is the largest portion of the tax bill, be increased by 2.6 percent. The assessment growth for 2021 was approximately 1.4 percent. This increase will be applied to Boards and Commissions as per the process approved by Council on December 5, 2018, where each will be allocated their individual pro-rated share of revenues resulting from growth in assessment. The budget directions and strategies approved by Council were used by staff to prepare the 2022 Draft Operating and Capital Budgets for Committee, Commission and Council consideration. As per the term of Council budget process the adoption of a guideline does not restrict Council's ability to amend the budgets during final consideration at Council.

Attached are the Crime Prevention Ottawa 2022 Draft Operating estimates approved by the Board at its November 1, 2021 meeting. The estimates represent an increase of 3.5% to the Board's 2021 Budget, which is within the annual allocation approved by Council.
