When the first responders found out the children had witnessed the event, people came to the house to show their support and concern for the wellbeing of my family.

They even sent a trauma counsellor with her dog to speak with the children. I was amazed at the outpouring of support.

Today, one of the officers, Nygil Enaman (sp) who I believe had led the officers that day came to the house to see how we were all doing. It was such a kind gesture and way beyond the call of duty.

I hope that all of the first responders who I did not get to meet that day know how much we appreciate their kindness and how they made a terrible day just a little bit less terrible.

Both this officer and another, also female were both professional and compassionate in pretty trying circumstances.

A third officer gave me some guidance on how to secure the door, which suffered a broken jamb. In as much as we're heartbroken about my neighbours demise, OPS obviously made the right decision with the forced entry and the officers exemplified the idea that policing is, at its heart, a caring profession.

Excerpt from Letter: I want to offer a note of praise and thanks to the officers who assisted with a call yesterday morning around 6 a.m. My elderly neighbour across the street is 92 years old and has dementia.

He had gotten out of the house during the early morning hours, unbeknownst to his wife, and wandered off. I saw their front door was partially open, went to check on them, and discovered he was missing from his bedroom.

I woke up his wife, and had her call 911. He had already been found a couple blocks away, but couldn't tell the officers more than his first name, apparently. The dispatcher connected the dots, and an officer arrived quickly to explain that they had him, had provided a pair of underwear for him (he'd gone out with only an undershirt on) and were bringing him home.

He arrived seated on his walker, happy, being pulled along by the officers (there were three now). The officers treated him gently, respectfully, and with some humour. Thank goodness one of them spoke German (whether by luck or because he was called in) because my neighbour's English is fading with the dementia.

I didn't get the officers' names, though wish I had so I could mention them individually here. I hope you can pull their names from the incident report and note wherever you do such things that they handled the situation very well, and with great kindness for my neighbor and his wife. As the neighbour who was involved, I wanted to express my thanks for their caring professionalism and humanity in this situation.

Excerpt from Letter: I am writing to commend one of your officers for coming by and speaking with the children in our neighborhood. Constable C. Bourguignon came by and

spent the better part of an hour interacting with the kids in our area. He showed the kids and parents the cruiser, let the kids play with the lights and siren, answered questions about his equipment, spoke about what life is life as an officer and generally brought some joy to a bunch of kids who have had an abnormal year and a half.

However, the effect of Constable Bourguignon continues on after his departure. There was a segregation of sorts on our street where kids played together based on ethnicity, why I have never found out. After the police cruiser tour all the kids are playing together. New friendships appear to be made and there is a new vibe when the kids are playing. Even the adults (parents) appear to have been brought together.

I'd like to thank Constable Bourguignon and the Ottawa Police for such an amazing experience and for bringing our neighborhood together!
