We understand other charges will be laid in our case. He was also able to locate and retrieve some items for myself and the other Ottawa client. This is incredible! Other Ottawa clients are coming forward as well.

So far, there have been no charges laid in the confession in Gatineau and the other Gatineau victims (at least 3) are still waiting to be contacted by a detective! Anything you can do to help get that moving would be wonderful as [name redacted] has been doing this for many years, with what we estimate to be at least 6 figures in dollar value stolen and fenced.

We are a culturally diverse group of friends and contacts, all in our senior years, who used [name redacted] through personal referrals. Detective Geller has treated those that he dealt with equally, with respect and understanding, and by-the-book.

While our case is still in progress, we are highly recommending a commendation for him as he is a fine example of how your community policing helps us.

On November 10th, at approximately 7:00pm, Constable Slobodian came to our facility to follow-up with one the residents who reported a sexual assault a few weeks prior. We were impressed by Constable Slobodan's approach with this particular resident. Constable Slobodian was warm, respectful, validating towards the residents feelings and emotions and showed flexibility when the resident was not in a place to follow-up with the report and talking about the incident.

During the interaction, the resident noted that she did not have a toothbrush. Constable Slobodian returned to our facility with a handful of toothbrushes, not only for the resident she came to support, but for the other residents who may need on in the house. Constable Slobodian gave the resident her card and invited her to call her if she wanted to chat further. This was such a kind gesture which conveyed to the resident that she was heard and valued. It also challenged some of the residents existing views of officers; to see police as supports rather than enforcers.

(Our facility provides supportive housing) for Women. We work with a verity of women who are struggling both with mental health and trauma. The approach used by the officer allowed the resident to feel some control over the situation and she noted it was a positive interaction. She often gets nervous around police, but Constable Slobodian made her feel very comfortable.

We want to say we are extremely grateful to Constable Slobodian for her approach and showing empathy and compassion in this situation. Thank you Constable Slobodian for being an amazing police officer and making a difference in the people you connect with.

Unfortunately, I did not catch the names of the 2 paramedics, but if at all possible, we would like to extend our praises to them as well, they were wonderful at the hospital.

As I received notification from the alarm company that something was happening at my father's house, you can appreciate that I was quite frantic as I had been trying to reach my father with no success. Constable Barrett quickly contacted me to give me the details of what was happening, and this, in a very soothing and calming manner, and assured me that my father was well taken care of and that he would be transferred to the Queensway-Carleton hospital. He also assured me that he would remain at the house until my husband and I could arrive, as I live 50 minutes away from my Dad's home.

As promised, Constable Barrett was still there when we arrived, and again was so very kind, he was very sorry for having to break the front door, for which we told him that on the contrary, we were grateful that he did get to my Dad swiftly. Truly, your service is very lucky to have Constable Barrett, he is such a very professional, conscientious police officer, but mostly a fantastic gentleman.

We were very lucky in that my father, although he is pretty banged up from the fall, is doing well and should recoup fully. I believe that this is in full part due to the great work Constable Barrett and the paramedics did.
