- Paused to hold gained ground at Mackenzie and to secure, clear area
- Clearing and cleaning streets and public spaces

- Ensured TV viewers and media were provided real time info and understanding

#### **Financial Update**



- We continue to track all costs and will seek full reimbursement from Federal Government
- National Capital Extraordinary Police Costs Program (NCECP)
- Currently, an estimated \$29.83M cumulative policing costs (as of February 22), expected to rise
- Operation is ongoing partner police services continue to be deployed
- Expected future increased costs associated with all protests and demonstrations (operational readiness)
