

--- Update on Operation to Remove Unlawful Protests



Day 1: Operation Launch

OTTAWA
POLICE



- Multiple warnings ignored, checkpoints, positioning of resources
- Actions on phase initiated
- Began in east and moved west
- Multiple arrests and vehicle seizures
- Assaultive behaviour and abuse from protesters
- Paused to hold gained ground at Mackenzie and to secure, clear area
- Clearing and cleaning streets and public spaces

Day 2: Actions On

OTTAWA
POLICE

- Safety precautions for officers
- Moved east taking and holding ground
- Multiple arrests, smoke bombs, flare, ARWEN deployed
- Crews began to fence off area to hold area
- Crowds dispersed by midnight

Day 3: Securing and Maintaining

- Police continued to secure area
- Fenced off area, began to shrink the secure footprint, multiple arrests
- Direct contact with BIAs and residents to address concern
- Remediation continues to shrink

Upcoming Weekend

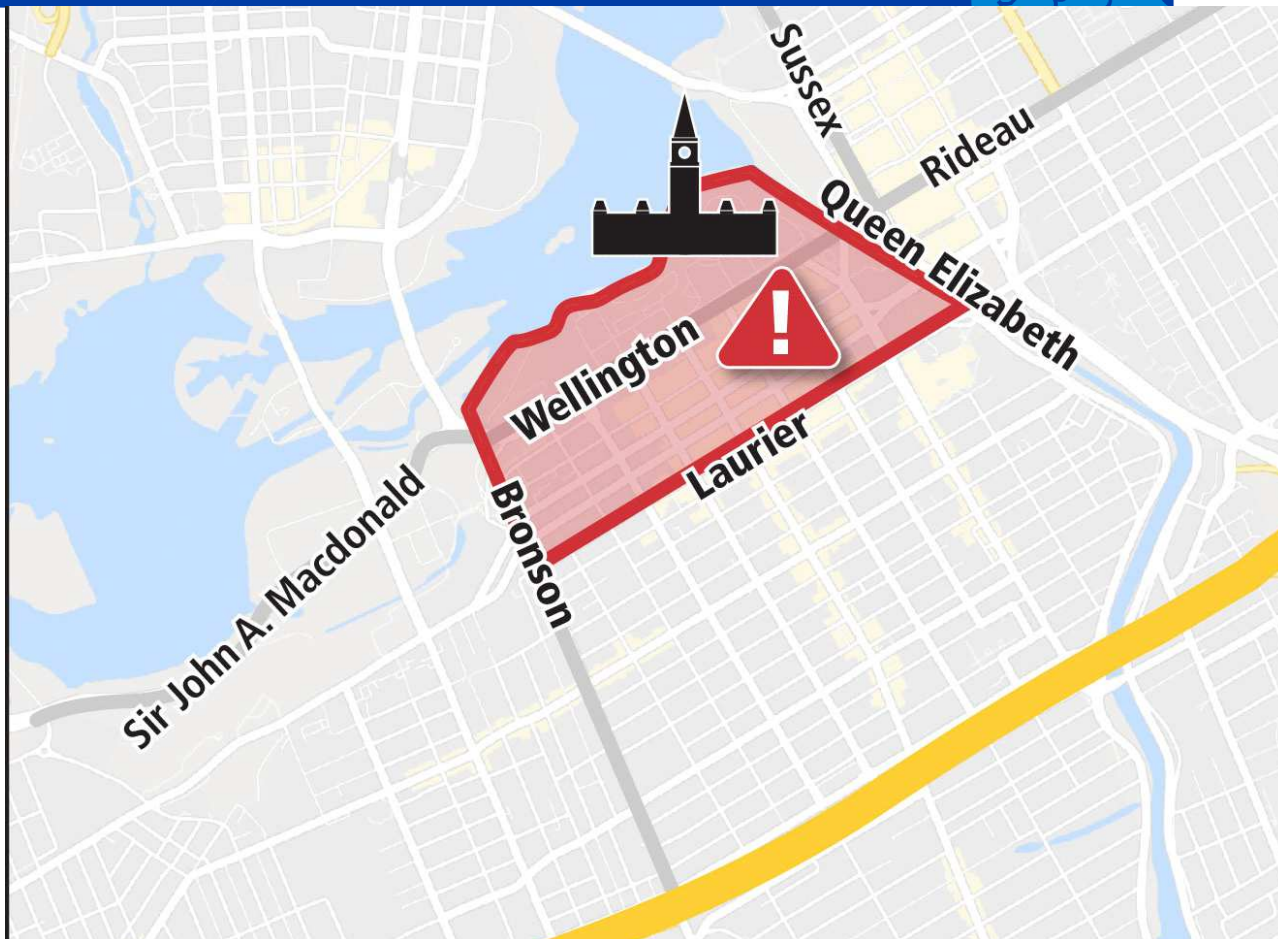


- Police presence, patrols and vigilance

Community and Communications



- Police Liaison Team and Communications worked to keep all informed
- PLT on the ground led to multiple successes/negotiations
- Communications focused on best practices, embedded social media team with incident commander
- Ensured TV viewers and media were provided real time info and understanding



Financial Update



- We continue to track all costs and will seek full reimbursement from Federal Government
- National Capital Extraordinary Police Costs Program (NCECP)
- Currently, an estimated \$29.83M cumulative policing costs (as of February 22), expected to rise
- Operation is ongoing – partner police services continue to be deployed
- Expected future increased costs associated with all protests and demonstrations (operational readiness)
