The past three years have been extremely difficult dealing our son, police have been to the home several times. Rather than speaking to our son alone, they spoke to all of us together. My husband and I had very little input, just verifying some things, or setting the record straight if our son was not being honest. The officers were polite, but firm with our son. When he was making up excuses, and blaming things on others, they called him on it. When he tried to change the subject because they were holding him accountable for something, they didn't let him change it, and pointed out that he was attempting to get out of answering what they asked. They spoke about being respectful to Dad and being responsible for his own actions. Several times I wanted to high-five the officers or thank them, because they were getting to the meat of the issue and saying the exact things we had been saying over the last two to three years. They were polite, but firm, using their personal experience to try to get through to him. I was really impressed with the way Csts. Carmichael and Entwistle approached the situation and tried to help. They ended with brokering a deal between Dad and son with respect to attending school, which was fair and doable.
