WHEREAS a professionally consulted viability study is a NCC lease condition;

WHEREAS the NCBG is seeking financial assistance from the Federation of Canadian Municipalities Green Municipal fund for the cost of the viability study, estimated at \$60,000; and

WHEREAS an endorsement from City Council is required in order for the NCBG to be eligible for funding from the Federation of Canadian Municipality's Green Municipal Fund;
